We're starting 2020 with a bold new attitude and a renewed determination to pay our ministry shares in full. The Finance Committee has committed to raising the amount we send monthly to the conference from 10 percent to 15 percent of our weekly operating budget proceeds. The committee is also working on a plan that will enable us to fund a Youth Ministry position. In addition, discussions were begun on how the church can set aside some funds for the next big roof or furnace repair/replacement project.

God bless each of you who have supported the church so faithfully throughout the year. Enjoy this holiday season as we celebrate Christmas and look forward to even more wonderful things in 2020!
