Spring is in the air! The sun is shining, trees are starting to bud, and I've got my office window open to let in the fresh air! Woo hoo! And on the fresh breeze floats hope like that feathered thing that perches in the soul.

It has been so good to see people in the church again! So, so good to hear people's voices raised in worship together! Last year at this time, I had to make the tough call to cancel Easter worship, and as hard as that was, I really believed that we were merely delaying our Easter celebration; not cancelling it altogether. Because here's the thing about Easter, and hope, and grace, and the love of Jesus Christ – *nothing* can cancel it! Nothing can permanently suppress the miracle of Easter. Resurrection is just that – it's new life that laughs in the face of death. But there is a brighter day coming, and Easter is the beacon that outshines the dark. Easter is the trumpet sound of hope.

For the first time in a year, we are making plans and putting dates on the calendar. We are anticipating activities and ministries and worship services and hospitality events that are all indicators of a church that is vibrantly alive. It's time to shake off the doldrums of a year-long pandemic. Stretch and reach and get warmed up, because it's time to get back in the game, and you are a part of the game plan! Everyone will have an opportunity to serve as we open the doors of the church and extend the love of Christ to the community around us, inviting families and children and youth to join us.

In the meantime, Holy Week and Easter are nearly upon us. I hope that you will join us for worship as we seek to grow in faith together. On Thursday, April 1st, we will have a Holy Thursday worship service where we will remember Christ's last meal with his disciples and we will celebrate Holy Communion in honor of Christ's direction to remember him in this way. And we will again gather for worship on Good Friday to hear the most difficult love story of all time. On Easter Sunday we will offer two identical services celebrating Christ's victory which is the genesis of our hope.

What Do I Need To Do? *From Mike Buckner, Chairperson & Jill Bell, Vice Chair of Mission Committee*



Thank you, thank you, thank you! Your generosity has allowed us to continue our ministry to the homeless in the greater Lansing area, through our partnership with Mason Community Church and the Cardboard Prophets we have continued to serve through a good portion of this pandemic. More about that in a moment.

Pastor Suzanne nailed it during her service on Sunday when she stated that this ministry is a “ministry of presence.” In that “ministry of presence” just the fact that you show up with a smile and a sincere desire to help is an act of service that the Lord can use to build His kingdom. Oftentimes someone will ask me “what is it that I need to do?” My general answer has always been to say “whatever you’re comfortable doing.” I’ve realized that that’s a pretty vague answer. So if you’re interested in serving, here is a step by step introduction into Dinner in the Park.

1. Load the vehicle. I can always use 1-2 people to help me load tables and totes into my truck. This generally will only take 10-15 minutes of your time.

2. Set up at the park. Set up includes unloading the truck, setting up the tables along the sidewalk and displaying the clothing on the tables from the totes. I would like at least 2 people on each of the 2 tables. Perhaps you’re physically unable to stand for 2 hours but

want to help. It’s okay to volunteer for a shorter period of time, or bring along a lawn chair. Sit, relax, when you need to. Remember, this is a ministry of presence. Your being present says to those less fortunate that “I care.” And isn’t that what Jesus says we should do? Love one another? *Truly I tell you tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me. Matthew 25:40.*

3. This is where the comfort level comes into play. Treating people with respect, we then need to determine what their needs are, and do we have what they need? Size? Fit? Etc! Just like in a store. If we can’t accommodate them, is there another table, from another church, nearby that can? There are knowledgeable people around to help connect people to resources. It’s a team effort and you will find many of the volunteers ready and willing to help, whether it’s with sizes, services, prayer, sharing, or listening.

The thing to realize is that there are other resources available that can help if we can’t. Example: oftentimes someone may ask for prayer. If you are not comfortable doing something like that (and that’s okay) let someone else know. There are others who are willing to do that. If you are not comfortable taking one of the homeless to another location, don’t do it, let someone else. Your comfort and safety are extremely important to me as well as to your enjoyment of this ministry.

4. Listen. Everyone has a story. It’s amazing what you might hear, how you might be affected, and what God might say to you. Where God might lead you.

5. Reload the totes with items that were not needed. Fold up the tables. Reload the truck and return to the church where we unload.

Finished for the month!

Back to donations. I have been thinking for awhile now how to better serve both my church and the homeless. Jill Bell and myself are putting together a monthly schedule of items that we hope to have donated. This does not mean that we no longer need your clothing donations but feel that often times we are overwhelmed by the amount of items donated. So, for example Mothers Day is in May. Our April wish list will be for those items that we would like donated to deliver in May. Our May wish list for items in June, June for July, etc.

We will be utilizing the SignUpGenius app. for those of you with computer access, we will be advertising these monthly opportunities in the church newsletter, and we will also be posting this as well on the Social Hall Missions Board. Please look for them and again, THANK YOU.

The collection for the homeless will focus on gift packs for Mother’s Day. Here are items we would like to collect during the month of April. Look for the signup-genius, coming soon, and thank you for your kindness and generosity.

Applications are available from the church office.



Think about a butterfly, and how it comes to be –
A caterpillar hatches from an egg and crawls to a bush or tree.

Then it spins (around itself) a cocoon and stays inside,
And changes start to happen while it's in there, trying to hide.

It takes some time, some sunny days, and then a glorious thing,
The cocoon opens to a butterfly, brightly colored on each wing.

How did it happen? We want to know -- it's a miracle we see.
Like the life of Jesus and Easter shows God's love for you and me.



MAKE A TIE~DYE BUTTERFLY!



Butterflies are often used as a symbol for Jesus and renewed life. While it's still too cold here to have them hatching from cocoons outside, you can make paper butterflies inside and decorate your doors and windows. If you want to make some, here are the directions!



What you need:


- White coffee filters (round)
- Washable markers
- Pipe cleaners / clothespins
- Water in a spray bottle

What you do:

1. Color with markers on the coffee filters. You'll need 4 filters for each butterfly.
2. Lay them on a wire baking rack over a dark towel or across the sink so you won't stain what is underneath them. Spray them with water so the colors will "run" on the filters. Then allow them to dry completely.
3. Accordion fold them (like a paper fan) and overlap the top and bottom paired wings at least 1 inch in the middle.
4. Take your pipe cleaner and fold it in half, winding it around where you have joined your wings in the middle. Twist the pipe cleaner to make a "body" of your butterfly and then make curly antennae up top. If you don't want to use a pipe cleaner, you can substitute a clothespin for the body.
5. Once your body is secure, unfold the wings to reveal all the beautiful colors on them!

Make eggs and flowers, too!

Just do steps 1 and 2 and then cut your filters into egg or flower shapes – it's a lot of fun to use this technique!






