My Dear Theophilus.

Adam Hamilton, in his introduction to his book *Luke*, offers some insight into the authorship of this beautifully written gospel. Experts believe that both the gospel of Luke and the book of Acts were written by the same person, who addressed these works to someone named Theophilus.



Who was Theophilus? We don't know. But the word Theophilus is made up of the Greek words Theo—meaning *God*; and Philus—meaning *loving friend*. So, Theophilus actually means "loving friend of God." Is it possible that Luke's address to "Theophilus" is actually his way of addressing these letters to you?


Whether there was an actual person named Theophilus, or whether the writing was meant to be for all loving friends of God, this journey through the season of Lent is a really special time when we reclaim our identity of being loving friends of God as we dedicate ourselves to more intentional prayer, reading of scripture, acts of self-discipline, and generosity. For six weeks... forty days... we sharpen our focus on all that God has done for us through the gift of his Son, Jesus Christ. And this dedicated time calls us to renew our commitment to be *active* in our discipleship—a practice which is not meant to melt away at Easter like the chocolate eggs.

I think of you often Theophilus, and I pray that this season of Lent brings you into a deeper and more meaningful connection with God, with our faith community, and with the best parts of yourself. And may God continue to bless you and give you peace in this Lenten season.




GROWING IN FAITH...

March Financial Update Glenn Darling, Treasurer

Wow! Two months of the new year are already behind us, and much has changed for the church financially. As the year began, we received quite a few one-time donations from people who take their required minimum IRA distributions and give their entire annual gift in a lump sum. We thank these folks for their generosity!

The good news is that this gave us about a \$20,000 bump in January. The bad news is that only about \$6,100 of that bump remains as of the end of February. In January we had a large bill for the broken water heater, and a Consumers Energy bill for over \$5,100, and of course, we're still feeling the impact of inflation. The biggest expense on our budget is payroll and benefits. Our payroll and benefits total nearly \$16,675 per month.

We began 2023 with about a \$10,000 "cushion" in our Operating Fund. However, we currently forecast that the cushion will be gone by about May at our current income/expense rate. The reality is, that we need to figure out additional ways to reduce expenses, or to increase giving.

In the meantime, EFT giving has increased and is helping to even out our cash flow, so we thank all those who have chosen this easy and efficient method of contributing. We're also figuring out ways to make casual/mobile giving easier to do since this is the wave of the future. And of course, the good news is that we continue to see new faces in our congregation every week, so we know we're continuing to do God's work of inviting friends and neighbors into active discipleship.

In this new year, we will be challenged to do all we can, and to always remain faithful and generous!



Bright Future Update

What's happening with Bright Future and when are we going to get that new sound system? We have a LOT of irons in the fire with the Bright Future updates underway! But it's important for us all to remember that to do a thing well, we need to take careful steps and do all of our due diligence. Plus, for each of the items on our Bright Future wish list, we need to accrue the funds before we spend! This month we're devoting some serious time pursuing grant monies from three different sources to help with the funding.

We're still in Phase I of our plan. We're meeting with a carpet firm this week to hear a new design presentation and receive a quote. If we like the ideas and corresponding price tag, we'll start looking at a timetable for installation. If we need to go back to the drawing board, it'll be a little longer.

We'll be meeting with David Gunns and Kim Sperry soon to discuss the design of the new Coffee Connection so that they can begin building that furniture.

What about that new sound system? Our sanctuary sound system isn't getting any younger, and we've heard from many of you about how difficult it is to hear! We hear you! Two realities are holding this necessary project up. First, the company that we were working with on this plan has changed their business model and has decided that our project is no longer in line with the scope of their work. Second, we do not yet have sufficient funds for this. Phase I of a new sound system will run close to \$40,000. We're hoping that the grant awards will get us closer to being able to get this work done. And we're in the process of looking for a new vendor for this work.

Finally, the Trustees agreed to begin looking for an architect to help us begin to envision sanctuary updates for the future.
