




The Search Continues...


YOUTH & CHILDREN...

- Haiti Assets for Peace International will receive 45% of the total offering. This Haiti Covenant Partnership supports the work of Mizak in South Central Haiti, empowering women and girls by providing health services, and vocational training.
- Another 45% will go to the Bishop Judith Craig Children's Village in Liberia. This fund provides basic needs, education, counseling and healthcare to orphaned and financially vulnerable children.
- The remaining 10% will go to "After the Storm" providing disaster relief for communities right here in Michigan.

What is Pentecost?

Pentecost is a special holiday in the life of the church. It reminds us of the time, long ago, when Jesus returned to be with God in heaven, and he sent his Holy Spirit to be with the disciples and with all of us.

The disciples weren't exactly sure what they would do now that Jesus was no longer with them, but as they were gathered on a special day, a mighty rush of wind blew through the place where they were sitting, and tongues of flame appeared over their heads as a reminder of the light of God's Spirit shining in them. And they began to speak in different languages. This was God's way of preparing them to go out into different parts of the world and share the exciting news of Jesus's love for everyone.

And they did just that! They traveled to places far and near, telling the stories and starting small churches in the towns that they visited. And that's why Pentecost is also celebrated as the birthday of the church!

The official color of Pentecost is **RED**, and some of the symbols of


Pentecost include flames, or a dove which represents the Holy Spirit, or even birthday symbols to represent the birth of the church!
