UWF: SERVING & SHARING

Loving our Neighbors-A Crisis on the Border

The United Women in Faith have a long history of involvement in issues of social justice, reminding us of Jesus's words, "Truly I tell you, just as you cared for the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, so you have cared far me." In October, the UWF hosted a Social Justice event called Our Borders featuring guest speakers Todd Tibbits, Chair of the YMCA National Coalition on U.S. Borders and Oscar Velasco, CCO of Mexican YMCA giving us first-hand information about the humanitarian crisis at our border with Mexico.

The politics of this issue are relevant and significant and need to be addressed. But in the meantime, there is tremendous human suffering, and the most vulnerable are taking the brunt of it. Families are fleeing the places they call home because of economic insecurity, political volatility, threats of violence, and a lack of ability to provide safety, health, and well-being for their children. They are so desperate for relief and hope that they are literally walking thousands of miles through extremely dangerous conditions in order to seek refuge. And when they arrive, they are finding no good options for legal entry and no safe place to be while they wait. Families are so desperate to find safety for their children that they are sending their children across the border unaccompanied in hopes that someone will take them in. The children may find refuge, but when they are caught or discovered they are often times sent back over the border with no concern for how they will reunite with their families.

It is easy to think that there is little that we can do to make a difference. And it's true that no single one of us can make a dramatic impact, but there *are* specific and tangible things we can do. First, we need to care. Care enough to learn the facts about this crisis. Care enough to speak up and speak out. Care enough to advocate for a

change to the system by reaching out to your elected officials. Politicizing this issue into a state of paralysis is not an acceptable humanitarian answer! Care enough to pray. And if you can, care enough to give.

Oscar Velasco told us that one

U.S. dollar was enough to provide a plate of healthy food and a tall glass of milk for a child who hasn't had one in far too long. Money won't solve the problem, but money will help provide immediate relief in the form of food, clothing, shelter, and medicine. It is important for us to remember that Jesus, himself, was a refugee, and Jesus implored us to have love and concern for our neighbors — all of them.

Thank you to the UWF for hosting this important education event that helped us to remember our neighbors.



Salvation Army Red Kettle Campaign

It's a holiday staple: people standing out in the cold, ringing a bell next to a Salvation Army sign. But who are they? Where did it all start?



The story dates back to 1891, San Francisco. Salvation Army Captain Joseph McKee was distraught at all the hungry people he saw living on the streets. He resolved to feed them. He remembered his days in the English navy when there was a large, iron kettle called "Simpson's Pot" into which passers-by tossed a coin or two to help the poor. The next day, Captain McFee placed a similar pot at the Oakland Ferry Landing at the foot of Market Street. Beside the pot, he placed a sign that read, "Keep the Pot Boiling." He soon had the money to see that the needy people were properly fed at Christmas.

His idea to feed the hungry has since grown to not only feed people, but to support homeless shelters, provide disaster relief, and more! This year, join in on making Christmas brighter for 25 million people. FUMC will be "ringing" at the Meridian Mall on December 2 from 10 a.m.— 8 p.m.

Noisy Bucket Mission Offering



- financial sustainability



November 5 4-6p.m.: Random Acts of Kindness in the neighborhood followed by a bonfire on the hill


November 19 4-6 p.m.: Breakfast with Santa Prep- we'll set up Santa's workshop and prepare for Saturday's event.
